Comfort Offering HIV Testing to Patients

Strongly Disagree	7.6%	3.4%
Disagree	4.5%	3.4%
Neutral	20.8%	16.9%
Agree	14%	15.2%
Strongly Agree	49.4%	43.3%

As a result of the Training I am more likely to offer testing

	Pre-Test	Post Test
Strongly Agree	8.4%	6.2%
Disagree	5.1%	3.9%
Neutral	32 %	19.1%
Agree	14%	14.1%
Strongly Agree	25.8%	38.2%

Identified Barriers

- Not Enough Time
- Clinic does not have guidelines for routine testing
- Not enough resources available in my clinic
- Payment for testing not clearly defined in my clinical setting
- State Laws

Future Plans for Evaluation

- 6 month follow up
- Random selection of 10% overall participants in the trainings in Year 1
- Quantitative survey to evaluate state of clinical sites
- Qualitative interviews with selected participants to assess long term effects of training.
